

## **Free Will, Agency, and Meaning in Life**

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Since the publication of *Living without Free Will* in 2001, many constructive objections have been raised for the free will skepticism I argued for there, and the position has evolved as a result. In this book I develop a revised and expanded version of my view. In the first four chapters I set out the updated arguments for the position, together with my responses to the objections that occasioned modifications, and in the last four chapters I advance a refined and embellished conception of its practical components. Two of these last four chapters are wholly new relative to the earlier book: they feature an account of rational deliberation consistent with the belief that one's actions are causally determined, and a forward-looking theory of moral responsibility attuned to skepticism about free will.
