

Henry W. Sage, member of Cornell's Board of Trustees from 1870 and its President from 1875 to 1897, founded the Sage School of Philosophy at Cornell in 1891 and named it for his wife, Susan Linn Sage, who had been tragically killed in 1885 in a carriage accident on Slaterville Road, southeast of Ithaca. The founding of the Sage School included his endowment of *The Philosophical Review* and the Susan Linn Sage Professorships, the first endowed named chairs at Cornell.
